COSFORD 2019 PUBLIC CAMPING INFORMATION

WELCOME

Welcome to this year's LMA model airshow - we hope that you enjoy the weekend!

To make sure everybody has an enjoyable and safe weekend this sheet has some important information, so **PLEASE ENSURE ALL MEMBERS OF YOUR PARTY READ THIS INFORMATION.**

IN THE EVENT OF A MEDICAL EMERGENCY RING 999

There are first aiders on site who can help while waiting for an ambulance so please ring **07827 675665** as well for immediate assistance and to also facilitate the smooth entrance and direction of the emergency vehicles.

BEHAVIOUR ON SITE

We are using this site by kind permission of the **RAF**, and to protect our continued use of the venue, anybody displaying anti-social behaviour or deemed to be acting in a manner which would preclude us from using the site next year will be asked to leave without any form of refund or re-entry next year.

Dogs must be kept on a lead and under control at all times. Please clean up after your pets.

SCOOTERS / THREE OR FOUR WHEELER BIKES / GOPEDS / MINI-MOTO / SEGWAYS and **HOVER BOARDS** are **NOT PERMITTED** on site.

GENERATORS are permitted but must be switched off between **10:30 pm** and **7:00 am**, to be considerate to the other campers on site.

CATERING is available over the weekend as well as a bar and evening entertainment.

NIGHT FLYING is allowed for **IC** powered models until **19:30** and quiet electric models until **23:00**. All flying to be under the control of officials on the main display runway at a designated point only, nowhere else on the airfield. Anyone flying a radio-controlled model must be a member of either the **LMA**, the **SAA** or the **BMFA**.

FIRE SAFETY

- To reduce the risk and spread of fire, please observe the required spacing between pitches, as directed by a camping marshal. Spacing must also be maintained between tents
- Do not block fire access lanes with parked vehicles etc.
- Each camping pitch should provide at least one fire extinguisher, manufactured to **BS 5423** or **BS EN3** and rated **13A** (equivalent to a 9.1 litre water/gas expelled or similar dry powder extinguisher where gas appliances are in use).
- Fuel burning cooking appliances including barbecues must be raised at least **300 mm** from the ground, must not be stood directly on the ground and must be used at a safe distance from caravans, awnings and tents.
- Fuel burning appliances must not be used inside tents or awnings.
- Where fuel burning cooking appliances or barbecues are in use, a fire blanket must be provided.

- Depending on site conditions, barbecues may not be permitted, and this will be clearly communicated before the event.
- **DO NOT LEAVE FUEL BURNING APPLIANCES OR HOT BARBECUES UNATTENDED OR DISPOSE OF HOT ASHES WITH GENERAL RUBBISH**
- No open fires are to be lit anywhere on site.
- When generators are used they must be situated a minimum of 3 m from any tent, caravan or vehicle. Generators must be switched off before refuelling.
- Fuel must be stored in containers that comply with The Petroleum (Consolidation) Regulations 2014 (PCR) and all containers should be stored away from any potential sources of ignition and in a well-ventilated location.
- In the event of a fire please evacuate everyone from the caravan or tent and raise the alarm immediately by ringing 999 and contacting a site official on 07827 675665 please state your exact location to also facilitate the smooth entrance and direction of the emergency vehicles.
- Fire-fighting equipment is provided in the camping areas; only attempt to extinguish a fire if you are competent in the use of the equipment, and it is safe to do so.
- In the event of an incident please follow the directions of show officials and ensure that your children remain with you and that they are aware of the dangers from attending fire engines.

ACCESS TO LMA COSFORD 2019



Access for campers from 14:00 until 18:00 on Friday 5 July will be via Crash Gate 4 at the south west end of Cosford airfield. **Please do not arrive before 14:00, and do not go to Cosford Museum, as there is very little parking space available.**

To avoid the traffic problems we have seen in previous years, **please do not drive through Albrighton**, follow the route given here shown on the map above.

Follow the A41 from the M54 past the turnoff to Cosford, through the traffic lights and under the railway bridge. Do not turn right and go through Albrighton.

Carry on the A41 for approximately 3 miles to the next set of traffic lights.

Turn sharp right onto the A464.

Follow the A464 for approximately 3 miles until you see the 'LMA' sign just after Bowling Green Lane and turn right into the airfield entrance. Do not go down Bowling Green Lane.

The nearest satnav postcode is WV7 3BT, but please follow the instructions and map above to get there.

Access from 18:00 on Friday 5 July onwards will be via Crash Gate 2 adjacent to RAF Cosford.

Everyone must be clear of the airfield by 20:00 on Sunday 7 July. If you wish to stay overnight on the Sunday, please speak to the camping manager on arrival.
